A Big Step to Changing Lives

Dhaulti was married off when she was 10 years old. She hails from a very economically deprived family in a small village, Chailanabad in Rajasthan. By the age of 18 years she gave birth to two daughters. Unable to give birth to a son, her in-laws and husband threw her out of the house with her daughters. Dhaulti had nowhere to go and no money.

This is the story of many young girls in the villages of Churu district in Rajasthan, where there is a high incidence of child marriage, preference for male child, illiteracy, abuse and economic hardships. But hope is not lost for these girls. Borukha Charitable Trust has set up an institution of primary education with vocation training for these girls in Borugram, a small village

Mahila Sikshan Vihaar or MSV is a non formal residential school which gives primary education up to class 5th stander along with vocational training to girls between the ages of 15 – 35. These women like Dhaulti come from extremely poor economic conditions. They have been victims of early marriage, abuse and discrimination. They never received any education It is little too late to formally educate these women, thus MSV seeks to give them non formal education and vocational training which will help them become self dependent.

Apart from education and vocational training these girls are provided with books, lodging & boarding, 2 dresses, hair oil, soap and free health check ups.

For girls like Dhaulti, MSV is a life saving and life changing experience. She wants to learn sewing and make a profession as a tailor.

MSV has given her life a fresh start. *“I want to stay and work here for 2-3 years”, says Dhaulti. “By then I will have enough money to educate my girls. I want them to learn. I want them to go to school because I know if I had been educated, I would have been able to do something in life and would not have been in this situation. I won’t let what happened to me, happen to my daughters.”*
